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From the Principal Jeffrey S. Theodoss

As the winter vacation draws near, I would like to wish everyone an enjoyable holiday and Happy New Year. Enjoy the time with your family and appreciate the good things you have in your life. Once again another year has flown by, students are returning from college and stopping at the high school to say hello. It's always good to see former students and reminisce.

Program of Studies and Scheduling Procedure

Below is a tentative timetable for course selection and scheduling for next year. I think it's important for parents and students to understand the time the guidance department and faculty devote to insuring that the needs of each student are appropriately met. In June, upon completion of this process, student schedules will be sent home with the final course selections. At this time any changes or concerns should be corrected through the guidance department. In August, students will receive their final schedule.

One of the important concepts for parents to understand is how their children select electives. Invariably, electives may only be scheduled in one or two time slots when the schedule is being built. For example, an SAT class may be scheduled during period 3 and period 7 on Monday, Wednesday and Friday. We ask for three choices from students when they are considering electives. Upper classmen will get priority scheduling, and once all students are assigned their major courses, the electives students sign up for may become problematic and may not fit into the student's schedule. While the probability of getting one of the three chosen electives is good, it is important that students are comfortable with the selection of all the electives they has signed up for. The same is true for students signing up for Advanced Placement Courses. Due to coursework requirements in the summer, students should begin to be comfortable /uncomfortable with the work load. Sometimes a student will realize that he/she may not be able to handle all of his/her selected AP courses, or the student decides not to do the summer work. If this happens that it is important any changes are to be made as early as possible when other course offering may be more available, rather than made during the first week of school.

There may be slight changes to the Program of Studies, but parents, by viewing the Program of Studies on the Foxborough website, eventually can begin the conversations with their children as to the courses they may be interested in selecting.

Jan. 5, 2009	New course proposals presented to the School Committee.
Jan. 8, 2009	High school guidance makes program of studies presentation to entire 8th grade class. Hand out sheet for students to begin picking electives with parents.
Jan. 12, 14, 16, 2009	Middle School teachers make recommendations with high school guidance counselors at their cluster meetings. Held at the Ahern.
Jan. 20-23, 2009	High school guidance counselors input recommendations of major classes into Power School.
Jan. 27-28, 2009	During 8th grade specials (<i>Wellness, Art, and Applied Technology</i>) high school guidance counselors will meet with all future 9th grade students' regarding course selections. Students should bring their elective choices to class. Guidance staff will meet with special education liaisons to discuss placement of students.
Feb. 3, 2009	Guidance counselors (including Grade 8) will meet at 11:30 a.m. with administrators and department heads to become familiar with the <i>Program of Studies</i> changes and the course recommendation/selection process.
Feb. 4 - 5, 2009	Guidance staff will meet with all 9th grade science classes to discuss POS and the scheduling process.
Feb. 5-6, 2009	Guidance staff will meet with all 10th grade social studies classes to discuss POS and the scheduling process.
Feb. 9- 10, 2009	Guidance staff will meet with all 11th grade English classes to discuss POS and the scheduling process.
Feb. 9, 2009	Homeroom will pass out the recommendation/ verification sheets to all students in grades 9-11. Sheets need to be completed by the <u>student and parent / guardian</u> by February 13, 2009. Teachers are asked to spend 30 seconds with each student during this week to complete the recommendation forms.
Feb. 11, 2009	<i>Program of Studies</i> night for parents / guardians of students. Presentation by Jeff Theodoss from 6:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. in the high school auditorium. Guidance staff will meet with parents and students in designated classrooms to discuss individual questions and concerns.

Feb. 23, 2009 - March 6, 2009	Guidance staff will meet with every student to schedule his/her classes into the computer system. Teachers are asked to send the students out of their classes at the requested time. (We understand this is an interruption to class time, but it is essential to get the schedule correct and completed in a timely fashion.
March 16, 2009	Guidance will run class requests with student's first choices.

Educational Proficiency Plan

*Important Notice from the Board of Elementary and
Secondary Education*

Parents/Guardians,

You may have heard that the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education voted to amend the regulation on graduation requirements related to the MCAS test. This amendment changed the criteria for earning a high school diploma by requiring all students, beginning with the class of 2010, either meet or exceed a scaled score of 240 on both grade 10 MCAS English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics tests, OR meet or exceed a scaled score of 220 on both tests **AND** fulfill the requirements of an Educational Proficiency Plan (EPP). Also beginning with the class of 2010, all students must additionally meet or exceed the minimum "needs improvement" score (a scaled score of 220 or higher) on the Science and Technology/Engineering MCAS Test.

The intent of these changes by the Department of Education is to increase the likelihood that graduates of Massachusetts high schools have the

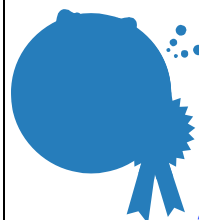
skills and knowledge needed to succeed in college and/or in today's workforce, which requires many of the same skills as college entrants. This letter is intended to keep you informed of what we at Foxborough High School will do to support your child's educational efforts. The school district is developing an Educational Proficiency Plan (EPP) for your son or daughter that will guide him or her toward reaching proficiency in the needed specific academic areas and meet the requirements of graduation. This Educational Proficiency Plan will include:

- a. a review of your child's strengths and area to improve, based on MCAS result, coursework, grade and teacher input.
- b. the courses your child will need to complete in grades 11 and 12.
- c. a description of the assessments that the school will administer on a regular basis to determine and document progress toward proficiency.

For most students, an Educational Proficiency Plan will simply be a continuation of the rigorous course of study they are planning on completing. Please be assured that we are making every effort to assist your child in fulfilling all state and local requirements for graduation from high school.

Scholarship***



From the Class of 2009 sixty-five students received the John and Abigail Adams scholarships for their performance on the 2007 MCAS tests. To qualify for this award students must have scored in the advanced category in at least one of the tests and a proficient in the other, and also their score must be

in the top 25% of the test takers from the school.

A tuition scholarship is available for any student choosing to attend a Massachusetts public school in the fall of 2008. The recipients were as follows:
