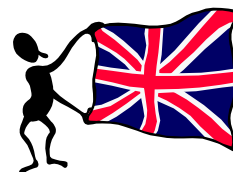

SAT Subject Tests- Some colleges require that students take one or more SAT Subject Tests. Take these in the spring when the material is fresh in your mind. You can download "Taking the SAT Subject Tests", which offers test-prep advice from www.collegeboard.org.

To prepare, download practice booklets from www.collegeboard.org (for the SAT) or from www.act.org (for the ACT).

What Juniors should be doing now: Start making a list of your abilities, social/cultural preferences, and personal qualities. List things you may want to study and do in college. Look at the Naviance website (<http://connection.naviance.com/foxborough>), to complete the career interest inventory, "Do What You Are," as well as college exploration.

Learn about colleges. Look at their websites. Make a list of college attributes and features that interest you.

Make a file to manage your college search, testing, and application data.

With your family, start to learn about financial aid. Read the *Department of Education's Funding Your Education*. Use *Getting Financial Aid* published by the College Board and the financial aid calculator at www.collegeboard.com to estimate how much aid you might receive. Begin a search for financial aid sources. National sources include the *College Board Scholarship Handbook* and electronic sources. Do not overlook local and state aid sources. MEFA is a great resource free of charge for Massachusetts's students. The phone number is:

1-800-449-6332 or you can look into it online at mefacounselor.org.

Visit some local colleges - large, small, public, and private. Get a feel for what works for you. February and April vacation are great for visits. Attend local college fairs.

Develop a list of 15-20 colleges that attract you. Request view books and information about financial aid and academic programs that interest you.

Take the ACTs and SATs.

If you are considering military academics or ROTC scholarships, contact your counselor before leaving school for the summer. If you want a four-year ROTC scholarship, you should begin the application the summer before your senior year.

If you have any questions, speak with your counselor and make sure you sent up an appointment with Mr. O'Neil.

Calling ALL Music Students!! FMA Scholarship Information



The Foxboro Music Association (FMA) is comprised of a group of dedicated parents who support a wide variety of musical activities and endeavors in the Foxboro Public Schools. One of the larger endeavors is the annual FMA Music Scholarship Program. These scholarships, which are awarded to middle and high school students, support further music education beyond in-school experiences (such as a music summer camp, private lessons or a musically-based enrichment program).

All students in grades 5–11 who are participating in some aspect of the Foxboro music program are eligible and strongly encouraged to audition for an FMA scholarship.

To be eligible, applicant must:

- Be a student in grades 5–11 in the Foxboro Public Schools.
- Be a current participant in a school-sponsored music group.
- Not have received a major FMA Scholarship (1st through 4th place) in 2017.

Applications should be submitted online by midnight on **March 31st**. Online applications will not be accessible after the deadline. *Please do not use student school email addresses on the applications. The schools block outside emails from reaching the students, so they would not receive any information sent via email.*

Audition Music: Students should select one instrument on which to audition. Each student must prepare a NEW piece for the audition. Please consult your private music teacher or ensemble conductor when choosing appropriate audition selections.

Audition Preparation: Students should be prepared to play scales and should bring three extra copies of music for the judges. Auditions for the Senior Division (grades 9–11) will be no longer than seven minutes.

Essay & Scoring: All students are also expected to answer an essay question on the role of music in their life. Essays for students in grades 7 through 11 will be worth 30 points of their total score and will be judged for both grammar and content. Music auditions will be worth 70 points.

FMA scholarships will be presented at the annual Pops Concert on **Sunday, May 6th**. Award winners and their families are invited to attend the concert as guests of FMA.
