From the Principal - Jeffrey S. Theodoss

Dear Parents and Guardians,

Let me begin by wishing everyone a Happy New Year.

As parents, it is a Happy New Year because all college applications have been sent in, you have enjoyed unseasonably warm weather and you haven't received your credit card bills yet. For seniors, the next few months will be filled with some anxiety as they await college acceptance letters or decide on future employment options. As parents, be patient and find those coachable moments to counsel your child. They may give the appearance that they know what they want to do, but they will welcome, although (*maybe not acknowledge*) your input.

January also marks the beginning of the scheduling process for the underclassmen. Much time and effort will be devoted to creating the best possible course schedule for each student. In this edition of the *Foxworthy*, you will find important information about the scheduling process. Every student will meet with his or her counselor to develop the most rigorous, yet appropriate, schedule for him or her. As I have mentioned in the past, it is imperative that parents and students spend time discussing their expectations and agree on student placement for each course.

There will be a Program of Studies Night on Thursday, February 9th with current eighth graders and their parents from 6:00 p.m. until 7:00 p.m. in the auditorium. All underclassmen and their parents will meet from 7:00 p.m. until 8:00 p.m.. There is more information about the upcoming **Curriculum Night** provided in this edition of the *Foxworthy*.

Also, twice a year at the end of both the second and fourth quarters, academic expectation reports are sent home along with report cards. These reports reflect student performance on the school wide academic / 21st century learning expectations. Each department is responsible for formally reporting out on two of the school-wide learning expectations. Attached in this newsletter are the rubrics that are used to report out on student performance.

Although not part of the FHS graduation requirements, the 21st century learning expectations demonstrate how students are performing in the areas of writing, reading, speaking, communicating, critical thinking, and effectively using technology. FHS believes these areas of performance are just as critical to a student's long term success as their understanding of the curriculum.

Preparing students for college or the workforce requires that each student has the ability to think both critically and creatively and to work collaboratively with a diverse group of people. Every student must be able to communicate their ideas to an intended audience both verbally and in writing and use technology appropriately. The enclosed graphs display individual classes (9, 10, 11, and 12) and performance scores, as well as composite grades and performance. Scores are reported out on a scale of one to four: **4**-Advanced, **3**-Proficient, **2**-Needs Improvement and **1**-Failure to Meet Requirements.

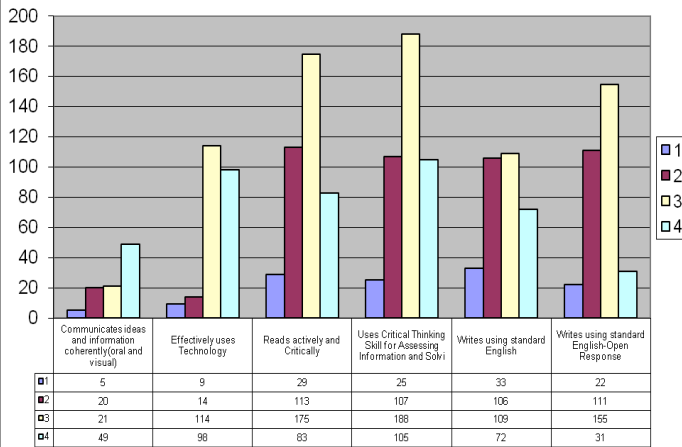
The graphs in the *Foxworthy* allow students to compare their scores with their peers. As previously mentioned, students will receive their individual performance scores at the end of the second quarter.

A social and civic rubric is also used to assess freshmen and sophomores during wellness classes on attributes such as integrity, respect for self and others, responsibility, appreciation for diversity and contribution to society. The social and civic rubric displays the combined grades (9&10) and performance scores.

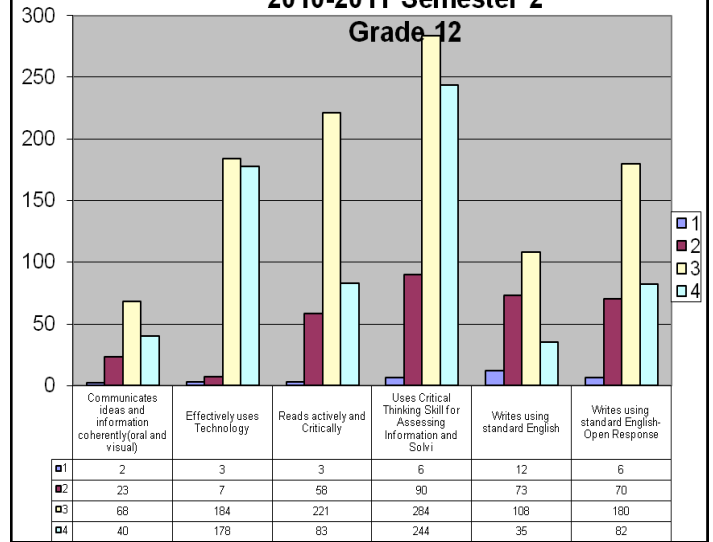

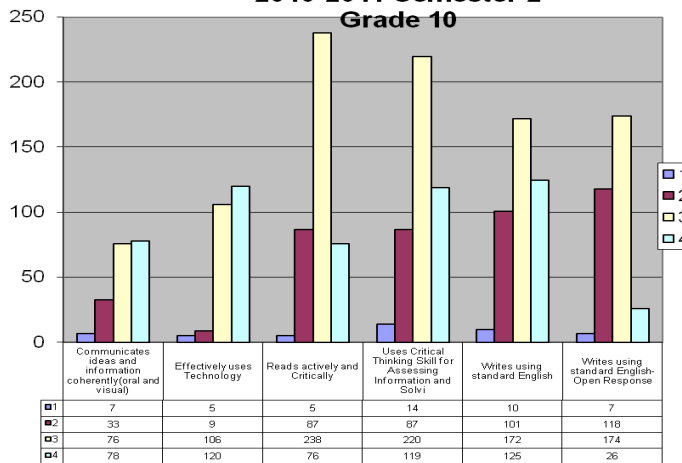
**2010-2011 Semester 2
Grade 9**



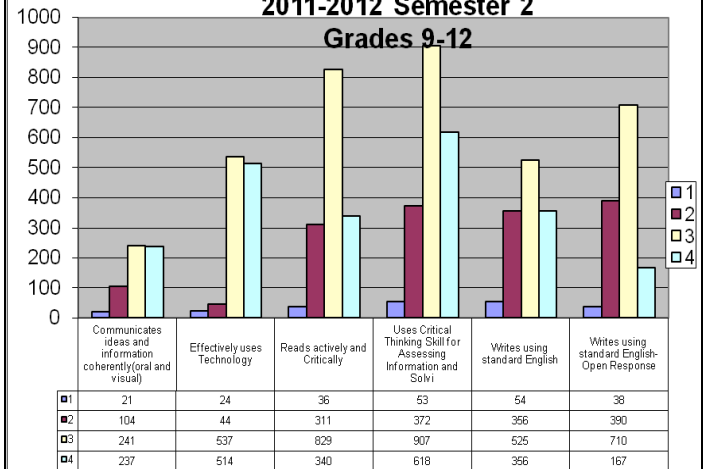
**2010-2011 Semester 2
Grade 12**



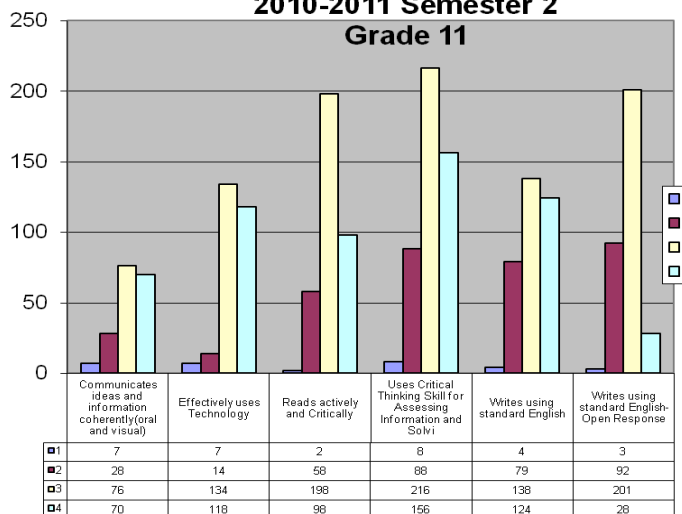
**2010-2011 Semester 2
Grade 10**



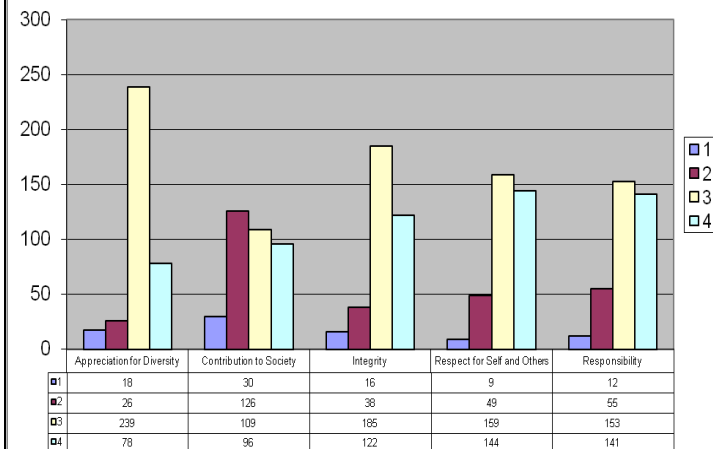
**2011-2012 Semester 2

Grade 9-12**



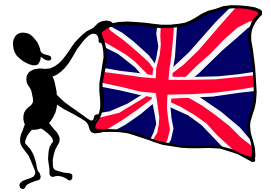

MATHEMATICS DEPARTMENT

TAKES INTEREST IN TOPOGRAPHICAL MAPPING

The Bay Colony Group had a team on site at Foxborough High School on Monday, Dec. 12th.

When the surveyors were working on a topographical map, mathematics teachers Ms. Relleva and Ms. Hutchison both brought their math classes outside for a quick lesson on surveying. The men were very informative. The transit that they were using was very high tech. It could do a lot of trigonometry! Outside was a bit cold, but our students didn't mind getting a first-hand demonstration about the art of surveying.

What is the "Warrior Huddle"

The purpose of the *Warrior Huddle* is to continue to personalize each student's education. The goals of the program are as follows:

- support the growth and development of all students,
- improve the school culture by having students and teachers get to know students they may not normally come in contact with,
- create an environment where relationships within the school, focus on cooperation and working together,
- provide a means for students to frequently assess themselves and plan for their future,
- provide each student with an adult other than a guidance counselor to advocate for them.

The program runs for 30 minutes every three weeks. One faculty member helps to mentor twelve students (*three students per grade level*).

We combined two groups during the first few sessions as team building and trust continues to be the focus of the lessons. Over time we hope that our students will serve as role models for each other and in addition to the group guidance program, provide avenues for students to seek out information and to be supported by an adult in a timely manner.

Curriculum Night

There will be two sessions, with the incoming eighth grade students and their parents meeting from 6:00 p.m. until 7:00 p.m. and then all grade 9-11 students and their parents meeting from 7:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. Each session will provide parents and students with an overview of the curriculum and requirements for graduation. Guidance personnel will be available to answer any questions.

Dear Parents/Guardians of Grade 8 -11 students:

During the next few weeks, middle school and high school guidance counselors will explain the course selection process to students in grades 8 through 11. Group meetings will be held during regularly scheduled classes and students will have the opportunity to ask questions about specific course requirements for graduation. Students will be told that they may schedule a private meeting with their counselor as well to discuss any concerns they may have. The guidance counselors have given each student in grade 8 a copy of *The 9<sup>th</sup> Grade Program of Studies 2012-2013*.

**The entire Program of Studies Booklet can be obtained on the FHS website: (<http://foxborough.k12.ma.us/fhs.htm>).**

Each student will also be given a personalized information sheet listing the courses for which they have been recommended for next year by their teachers. They will be asked to review this information very carefully with you. Please spend time to discuss these recommendations with your child. Teachers made these recommendations diligently.

Consideration was given to your child's current abilities and willingness to work independently. Your child's courses should be challenging and demanding. If you are not in agreement with the recommendation, please call the teacher **before Feb. 15, 2012**, to discuss the recommendation. After you discuss the recommendation with the teacher and a change is requested, the parents, student and teacher will all sign the override form which must be returned to your child's guidance counselor when finished before any change will be made.

As your child completes his or her required courses, there will be more of an opportunity to enroll in elective courses. Every effort will be made to honor your child's elective requests.

Some courses may not be available for your child next year due to limited enrollment or scheduling conflicts. Notification of any cancelled courses will be made as soon as the total enrollment has been verified.

A program for parents will be held on **Thursday, February 9, 2012** in the high school auditorium. (**Grade 8– 6:00 p.m. – 7:00 p.m.**) (**Grades 9-11 – 7:00 p.m. – 8:00 p.m.**) Requirements for graduation will be explained and guidance personnel will also be available to answer any questions.

## Attention Seniors!

### Seniors-Submitting College Applications

The college application season is in full gear and the hustle and bustle of submitting transcripts on time brings up questions about the process. We would like to provide you with information that will help you navigate the process.

1. Bring your “Brag” sheet to your guidance counselor.
2. Ask a teacher to write a recommendation for you. Give them a copy of your “Brag” sheet.
3. Fill out the transcript request form and hand into guidance with your \$3 for mailing. Do this at least 1 week prior to deadline.
4. Send your SAT and/or ACT scores from College Board. This may take up to 3 weeks for your college to receive the scores from College Board.
5. Complete college application and send.

Colleges and universities have a specific process they follow after they download application documents. Often times, documents that we send through Naviance eDocs are not immediately available to the admissions office at the college or university. Many schools receiving a high volume of applications may need several weeks for the information to be updated in their system.

When we send a document via Naviance eDocs we receive a confirmation of electronic delivery. This confirmation is notifying us that the documents have been received at the institution. However, it **does not** mean that the documents have been entered into the college/university’s admissions database.

Do not panic if you receive an e-mail indicating something is missing. Colleges are often a couple weeks behind in entering the information on their database.



With our continuing effort to “GO GREEN” and reduce the expense and amount of paper used to photocopy the 100 page Program of Studies Booklet-we have put it on- line (**beginning January 10<sup>th</sup>**). Click on the “Program of Studies ”on the left side of the FHS main page.

While you are there be sure to sign up for the “**FHS Email list**” so that you will get updates from the principal via email. If you wish to have a hard copy of the Program of Studies booklet, we have copies available in the main office or guidance office of the high school.

## Financial Assistance for College

Over 94% of New England College students receive financial assistance. This assistance comes in a variety of forms, including: federal grants, loans and federal work study, as well as, New England College funded scholarships and grants.

To determine your eligibility for assistance, file the **Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)** online as soon after January 1, 2012 as you can. It is important to submit the application as early as possible to maximize available funds for your financial aid package.

The New England school code for FAFSA is **002579**.

In the guidance office we also have a spreadsheet that lists National Scholarships students can choose to apply to.

On January 11<sup>th</sup> we will be having an assembly for all seniors to hand out the Town of Foxborough Scholarship packet. These must be completed and turned into Ms. Warnat, in guidance by February 10<sup>th</sup>.
